IEA Orders Ministries to Prioritize 'Generation of Power Through Coal'



The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan's Economic Commission, chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar, gave orders for various ministries to prioritize projects to generate electricity by using coal.

In a statement, the commission said after "extensive discussions on all issues that the private sector is prepared to invest in" it was decided that the generation of electricity should be a priority.

According to the statement, the commission instructed the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum; the Ministry of Trade and Industry; the Chamber of Industry and Mines; as well as the Chamber of Commerce and Investment, under the leadership of the Ministry of Energy and Water, to generate electricity from coal for industrial parks, and large cities among other sectors.

The commission also ordered the relevant bodies to "set priorities according to the volume of coal and the need for electricity, and... *Cont P#4*

I had terrible days," said Ahmad Shah, a drug user.

During the past several months over 2,000 drug users were brought to the facility in Herat, of whom 800 have recovered and joined their families, officials said.

Provincial Governor Mawlawi Noor Ahmad Islam Jar said that these drug users had been intentionally persuaded to use drugs.

Afghan Coal Exports Increased by 16%

Export of Afghan coal has increased by 16% compared to the same period of the previous year, said the Ministry of Finance.

Afghanistan has exported over 1.8 million tons of coal abroad, according to the Ministry of Finance. Most of the coal was exported to Pakistan.

"The majority of our exportation is to Pakistan. Some traders export the coal from Pakistan to other countries," said Ahmad Wali Haqmal, a spokesperson for the Ministry of Finance.

According to the MoF, Afghanistan exported over one billion Afs worth of coal between 1399 to 1400 solar year, but over the past 7-month exports of coal have increased by 16 percent compared to the same time last year.

Economists believe that the coal should be extracted through a systematic process.

"Previously, Pakistan was importing coal from Australia. Now the prices have increased and made it ten times more expensive by sea. Afghanistan is a discount for Pakistan," said Azeraksh Hafizi, an economist.

The biggest coal mine is in the north of Afghanistan. #

Afghanistan currently generates over 600 megawatts (MW) of electricity from several hydroelectric plants as well as using fossil fuel and solar panels. However, an addition 670 MW is imported from neighboring Iran, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan but holds 73 million tons of proven coal reserves as of 2016, ranking 62nd in the world. However, estimates put the total reserves at between 100 million and 400 million tons. A shortage of power has plagued Afghanistan for decades despite having ample

hydropower, coal and fossil fuel resources. #



transport, taking into account Afghanistan's high transit potential," the minister said.

"In general, the 140 enterprises built by the Soviet Union in Afghanistan remain the backbone of the Afghan economy, and this creates additional opportunities for increasing our cooperation in the trade and economic sphere," Lavrov said.

Officials in the Chamber of Commerce and Investment (ACCI) said they consider this step to be beneficial for the country in the current situation.

"By doing so, our agriculture grows and progresses. In addition, our domestic production includes non-alcoholic beverages, water, soft drinks, will grow," said Khan Jan Alokozai, head of the Chamber of Commerce and Investment. Russia has been Afghanistan's trading partner for the past 20 years, exporting some of its oil and iron to Afghanistan. #
